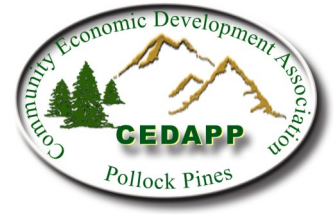

able to stay for the whole session. You can see them in the photo above, analyzing some data and participating in the exercise.

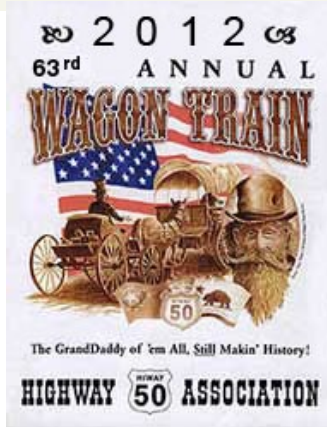

Of course, you won't be reading this, because you aren't from around here. You came in from somewhere else, or worse, you sent your henchmen to do your work and you've never even been to the business you're trying to bleed to death. Do you get a warm, fuzzy feeling when you watch a business die because of what you did?

The ADA vulture has struck Pollock Pines again. You know them, the attorneys who file Americans with Disabilities Act lawsuits on small businesses, usually sending teams of little vultures in to take photographs, not even trying to go in themselves. One of these vultures has already caused a couple of Pollock Pines businesses to go out of business.

Did I just imagine it, or is it true that some members of our state Assembly blocked efforts to amend the ADA in order to stop abusive practices? Ask Sen. Bob Dutton (R-Inland Empire) [California Citizens Against Lawsuit Abuse](#) reports, "the Americans with Disabilities Act was meant to increase access for disabled people, but a few unscrupulous personal injury lawyers and professional plaintiffs have made fortunes by targeting businesses for shake down lawsuits. Oftentimes these lawsuits are filed when access

has not been deterred in any way. These lawsuits don't ask for any accessibility improvements to be made, they ask for money to make the lawsuit go away." (From Cal Watchdog, Feb 2012). Some business simply cannot afford to pay off the serial lawsuit filers and have to go out of business. Fixing the problem to get out of the bind is not an option.

## A COMMUNITY -OWNED RESTAURANT?



### SPORTSMAN'S HALL PROPOSAL

The historic **SPORTSMAN'S HALL** was the site of a not-uncommon proposal last Friday evening. Jason Story and Tawnia Ceo, both veterans of **SEQUOIA RESTAURANT**, and Jim Verdi, a veteran of restaurant finance, presented a proposal that would get the **SPORTSMAN'S HALL** re-opened within months. The proposal calls for ownership of this historic operation by the public, in somewhat the same way the Green Bay Packers football team is owned by the citizens of Green Bay, Wisconsin.

As you can see, the new venture would be known as **12 MILE RESTAURANT AT SPORTSMAN'S HALL**. Any of us could buy shares, although the details of corporation vs. co-operative would have to be worked out. This is far from a done deal, and a number of concerns were raised by attendees, mostly about the viability of such an operation and the draft menu.
